

YEAR IN REVIE



Dear Friends.

We are pleased to present California Farmland Trust's (CFT) 2020 Annual Report. As we all know, 2020 was a year of unchartered territory. While all things normal seemed to be cancelled, we cautiously charged ahead while utilizing our "shelter in place" time to truly focus on internal operations and our own sustainability. After all, we protect farmland in perpetuity, so it is important CFT has a viable business model to service the farmland we protect.

Our perpetuity study involved consultants, staff, and full board and committee engagement. We looked at our financial model, reevaluated practices and funding structures to ensure a safe, robust, and balanced fiscal operation. We are ensuring we are as sustainable as the land we protect. Through the guidance of our perpetuity planning efforts, we have sharpened our practices and policies to meet this goal.

In 2020, we began working on the seven projects we secured grant funding for in 2019 and continued to work with several other interested landowners who wanted to place their land under an agricultural conservation easement. 2020 also celebrated another farm being protected in Merced County. The Vander Woude Family elected to protect nearly 65-acres of row crop land that nicely complements our existing efforts in Merced County. Looking forward to 2021, we anticipate closing five projects from our work that began in 2020, adding an additional 645 acres. All in all, it was a rewarding year for farmland protection.

As we continue to focus on our vision, we expanded our Board of Directors welcoming Ryan Jacobsen from Fresno County Farm Bureau, as well as Theresa Kiehn from AgSafe. Our leadership also changed in mid-2020. Ron Freitas completed a successful term as board president, and we welcomed Jon Harvey as the new board president. Jon has been actively involved in farmland protection and we are grateful for his leadership as president. We welcomed Becca Whitman from Raley's; California FFA State Officer, Mia Arisman; and Young Farmers and Ranchers State Chair, Jennifer Beretta to our Trustee Council. Like many organizations, we took time in 2020 to ensure our leadership represents a diverse cross-section of agriculture and experience to help us achieve results.

Field Trips to the Farm, our educational partnership with Raley's, was also paused in 2020. Fortunately, we were working on expanding our educational tools and in mid-2020, we released Orange You Glad We Have Farmland curriculum with California Foundation for Ag in the Classroom and Raley's. The poster-based activity highlights how little farmland we have to feed a growing population. While the curriculum is geared toward elementary students, the meaningful reaction we've received from high school students and adults has been positive. It is an impactful visual activity - if you have not checked it out yet, we highly encourage you to visit our website to learn more.

Despite the uncertainty of 2020, we collectively made the most of of the year and achieved some successful milestones. We dedicated time that would have otherwise been spent at events and conferences doing internal upkeeping and the steadfast support and dedication of our staff, leadership, volunteers, landowners, sponsors, donors, and friends, allowed us to ensure our mission remained relevant. As a result, we are stronger and more vigilant towards our efforts to ensure we're efficient and effective in our charge to protect the most valuable farmland in the world.
